La Newton School of Beauty Culture

Founded in 1949 by Elizabeth O. Newton, the La Newton School of Beauty Culture opened its doors at 462 Massachusetts Avenue in the South End. That same year, Ola B. Gregory, fresh out of college, ventured north to Massachusetts with seven children and a desire to do hair. Six years after laying claim to Boston, Ola enrolled in La Newton making her dream a reality.

La Newton relocated to Grove Hall in 1962 to train growing numbers of African Americans in cosmetology. 636 Warren Street was the address for the

next 48 years. As Murphy Gregory, son of Ola and current Director, puts it, "She [Elizabeth] and my mother could benefit from [La Newton] being in a black community, that is why it is here. Black people get their hair done and want to learn how to do hair." Valarie Gregory, wife of Murphy and Co-Director followed up



stating simply "there was a preponderance of black people in our area who wanted to learn cosmetology."

The need for quality service and La Newton's culture for superior standards fostered a strong bond between Grove Hall and La Newton. In 1969, Ola, was ready and able to purchase La Newton from Elizabeth. Ola kept the La Newton name and continued the standard of excellence. (continue page 2)

For the next 18 years, Ola kept La Newton's footprint in Grove Hall, until her passing in 1987 leaving Murphy and Valarie to take the helm.

As the oldest continually owned minority cosmetology school in New England, La Newton out grew its facility after nearly 5 decades at 636 Warren Street. While students continued to receive an exemplary education, the Gregorys believed the school needed to modernize. Other cosmetology schools could claim a salon atmosphere for students, so La Newton, second to none, believed students deserved no less and moved to 350 Blue



Hill Avenue, still keeping its Grove Hall presence. "We didn't need the large lobby we used to have, but we did want the latest equipment, fresh paint and new chairs to attract younger students," stated Murphy.

The demographics in Grove Hall have changed from La Newton's first appearance, but students of all backgrounds continue to find La Newton a launching pad for their careers. Over 4000 cosmetology professionals have called La Newton home and alumni consist of African Americans, Latinos, Haitians, Jamaicans, European Americans and countless other groups. These outstanding graduates go on to open salons and have learned techniques for sculpting ethnic hairstyles other competitive schools have not offered.

La Newton, a family business, understands that students have intense schedules. Flexibility is key to accommodating mothers, fathers and individuals employed full or part time. There is also limited scholarship aid available. Valarie and Murphy live, shop and work tirelessly in Grove Hall. They continue to build their business and serve the community. The Gregorys are proud that La Newton is Black owned and have enjoyed watching additional Grove Hall businesses follow suit. As the dust settles in La Newton's new Grove Hall location, Murphy and Valarie look forward to passing the torch on to their children. As current business managers and instructors, this next generation is expected to continue La Newton's legacy for decades to come.
