Migration to EMV Chip Card Technology and Your Small Business



MAKE THE SWITCH OR PAY THE PRICE

DID YOU KNOW?

Beginning on **October 1, 2015**, if your small business is not EMV-compliant in certain fraudulent transactions - you as a merchant could be liable.

U.S. credit card companies are making the transition from magnetic stripe technology to cards with chips. Chip cards are payment cards that have an embedded chip, offering increased security when your customers use the chip to pay in store. Chip cards are based on a global card payment standard called EMV, which stands for Europay, MasterCard and Visa, currently used in more than 80 countries around the world. The United States is now in the process of making the migration to EMV technology. **Read more**

Here are a few quotes from the article...

Ed Gaskin, executive director of the Greater Grove Hall Main Streets cited a public health impact as well.

"Given the higher incidents of respiratory diseases such as asthma in our community, we support programs such as DriveBoston," he said.

"It would be ideal if as part of the DriveBoston program, there was some reduced rates or subsidies for membership or usage. The same way some companies provide subsidies for public transportation," said Gaskin. He added that more people are likely to try the program if initial rates are lower.

Gaskin saw economic potential for the neighborhood. "Residents need more flexible options when it comes to transportation, as that could increase employment opportunities," he said.

Gaskin pointed out that this program is not the only transportation solution worth pursuing. "Besides car share programs, our communities are also underserved when it comes to bike share (Hubway) programs as well," he said. "[Grove Hall] would like the mayor's assistance in helping us implement our Complete Streets study."


