The City of Boston is committed to supporting small businesses through the reopening of our economy. The Reopen Boston Fund will help small businesses put in place the necessary public health guidance requirements needed to reopen in the coming months. The funding is to be used for PPE and other safety measures.

This fund is intended to support businesses with a majority of employees working in close proximity to their clients and each other. Please note: We will not consider professional service businesses, including those that are able to work from home or any online businesses, for our grants.

Applications will open on Thursday, May 28th at 5:00pm and will be reviewed and approved on a rolling basis and be awarded in a phased approach as business types are approved to reopen over the coming weeks.

For Restaurants Interested in Outdoor Seating

The Licensing Department has simplified the process and there is no fee to apply. A restaurant owner can request the extension for their own private property or to use public space. It is a 2 phased approach. Once the owner completes the initial questionnaire the Licensing Board will send a second application with additional questions to be answered and information uploaded.

The applications to use private property are quickly reviewed and approved. The public space applications must go through several city departments so that process will take longer depending on whether it is a sidewalk, a parking space, a parking lot or a public park that the restaurant wants to use. This is a great opportunity for the restaurant to not only open for outdoor dining, but to test whether it is a strategy that they may want to try to adopt permanently if allowed.

An open letter to our Massachusetts government staff and elected officials

As Massachusetts moves into Phase Two of the COVID-19 re-opening plan, there are
more than 2.6 million people struggling with food insecurity- which means 1 of out of every
6 children is going hungry.

Meanwhile, 80% of restaurants remain shuttered, leaving 93% of low-wage workers out of work (*Source: Massachusetts Restaurant Association*). The impact is overwhelmingly on Black, Indigenous and People of Color (BIPOC), most of whom had already been living paycheck to paycheck, including a large percentage of undocumented immigrants who are ineligible for unemployment or other government safety nets. These workers, who have spent their lives feeding their neighbors, are now the ones standing in line at food banks and soup kitchens, struggling to feed their families.

Scholarship Program for Latin American Students

NBCUniversal/LNESC National Scholarship Deadline: July 24, 2020

The NBCUniversal/LNESC Scholarship Program is intended to assist and encourage outstanding undergraduate Latino students attending a U.S. post-secondary institution with an interest in the media and entertainment industry. The Program awards ten (10) \$5,000 national scholarships to qualified rising sophomores and juniors and is sponsored by NBCUniversal and administered by the LULAC National Educational Service Centers (LNESC).

Eligibility Requirements

Applicants must meet the following criteria to be considered:
