## Phase 3 Step 1 in Boston Starts July 13

Businesses that are reopening in Step 1 of Phase 3 must follow specific guidance. Face coverings, social distancing, sanitization, and hygiene measures remain in place, in addition to updated gathering limitations.

The state is restricting crowds in indoor enclosed spaces to no more than eight people per 1,000 square feet, or 25 people overall; Outdoor spaces can have 100 people. You can learn more on the state's website.

Below are some but not all sector-specific guidelines. <u>Thanks to Patch.com for the</u> <u>synopsis.</u>

- Movie theaters and outdoor performance venues:
  - Forty percent of individual theater or screening room capacity; For outdoor performances, singing and the playing of brass and wind instruments is discouraged.
- Museums, cultural and historical sites:
  - Forty percent capacity; Consider using timed entry tickets/reservations and imposing time limits for visits to ensure compliance with occupancy limits.
- Guided tours:
  - Fifty percent capacity for buses or other vehicle (such as a trolley, harbor cruise vessel, or duck boat;) Walking groups of no more than 10 peoples.
- Fitness centers and health clubs:
  - Activities such as Weight and resistance training; Cross training; Yoga; Martial arts; Spin classes; Boot camp training; Forty percent capacity; Equipment and exercise areas are spaced out at least 14 feet apart; Distribute hand sanitizer and disposable wipes abundantly throughout the space for workers and customers to disinfect their hands and equipment before and after use.
- Certain indoor recreational activities with low potential for contact:
  - Includes batting cages, driving ranges, bowling alleys, go karts, and rockclimbing facilities. Things like roller skating rinks, trampolines, obstacle courses and laser tag will open in part two; Forty percent capacity.
- Professional sports teams, under the authority of league-wide rules, may hold games.
  - No fans.

#### **PPE & Cleaning Supplies**

We have created a guide on PPE and cleaning requirements needed for businesses to reopen. This database also allows businesses selling PPE and cleaning supplies to add contact informationa nd promote their resources.



#### COVID-19 CASES

The City of Boston has 13,556 positive cases of coronavirus (confirmed and presumptive). So far, 9,504 of these 13,556 residents have fully recovered. Unfortunately, there have been 710 COVID-19 related deaths in Boston.

The City posts race and ethnicity data for deaths, as well as for confirmed cases here.

The Boston Public Health Commission will be providing the updated total of cases in Boston residents as it is received from the Massachusetts Department of Public Health. Information can be found at <u>boston.gov/coronavirus</u> or<u>bphc.org</u>.

Massachusetts has 110,137 **positive cases of coronavirus** (confirmed and presumptive) and 8,198 deaths reported at this time. Massachusetts has also tested 899,417 individuals to date.

Free Bluebikes Passes for Boston's Grocery, Pharmacy, Restaurant, and Retail Workers

#### Hi friends,

As the region continues to reopen, the City of Boston has a great opportunity to help many employees get to work. The Boston Transportation Department is offering <u>free 90-day</u> <u>Bluebikes passes</u> to help out some of our most important workers: those employed at grocery stores, pharmacies, restaurants, and local retail shops. Anyone who works in these industries in Boston is eligible for the pass.

Bluebikes is public transportation by bike, providing a convenient way to get around the

city while maintaining physical distance from other people. Most of Boston's small business districts are served by Bluebikes. Workers can pick up a bike near their homes and park it at a station near work. During the free 90-day period, pass-holders will be able to take as many trips as they like, though trips must be completed within 60 minutes to avoid usage fees. There is no obligation to pay for a pass once the free 90 day period is over.

JP Centre/South Main Streets and <u>JP Local First</u> have partnered to provide design and technical assistance for businesses that need help applying for outdoor dining and seating. Several local volunteers have partnered with the design firm of make/do studio (<u>Samuel</u> <u>Maddox</u> and <u>Braxton Tanner</u>) to create varying plans to meet business needs. The plans are available for community use, free of charge.

We have also partnered with online merchant <u>Wayfair</u> to provide business/professional accounts to local businesses, who need to secure furnishings for outdoor areas. Furnishings are available a la carte or to match the design plans from make/do studio.

Alternatives to jersey barriers: if you are in need of jersey barriers for your outdoor seating, we may have alternatives for you to consider, with recommendations from the Boston Transportation Department. Jersey barriers are required for outdoor seating areas within parking lanes, and have been increasingly difficult and expensive to obtain.
