\$50.8 Million in Grants Available to Support Massachusetts Small Businesses

New Grants for Small Businesses Applications Open Until 11/13

The <u>Commonwealth of Massachusetts</u> has announced \$50.8 million in grants available to support Massachusetts small businesses, microenterprises, and their employees, families and communities. <u>Massachusetts Growth Capital Corporation (MGCC)</u> will be administering these funds, available to businesses with fifty (50) employees or less experiencing economic hardship and a loss of income due to the COVID-19 pandemic. These funds were appropriated through the Commonwealth's Supplemental Budget for Fiscal Year 2021 (FY21) as well as the CARES Act of 2020 and are divided into two programs. If you have five (5) or fewer employees, review both programs carefully before deciding which one to apply for.

GRANTS:

- <u>SMALL BUSINESS GRANTS FOR 5 OR FEWER EMPLOYEES (up to \$25,000)</u>
- SMALL BUSINESS GRANTS 50 OR FEWER EMPLOYEES (up to \$75,000)

COVID-19 CASES


The City of Boston has **19,986** positive cases of coronavirus. So far, **17,279** of these **19,986** residents have fully recovered. Unfortunately, there have been **778** COVID-19 related deaths in Boston.

The City posts race and ethnicity data for deaths, as well as for confirmed cases here.

Massachusetts has **150,498 positive cases of coronavirus** and **9,700** deaths reported at this time.

Boston Testing Pledge






SBA & Treasury Announce Simpler PPP Forgiveness for Loans of \$50K or Less


